

The Treatment Provider

- f. The purpose of the treatment provider is to provide early identification of chemically dependant offenders and to insure that drug-involved offenders receive the appropriate treatment and supervision through early intervention.
- g. Effective cooperation and communication between treatment providers and the Court is essential for a successful Drug Intervention Program.
- h. The Treatment Provider must agree to:
 - 1. Provide all clients referred to the Drug Intervention Program with a prompt, comprehensive assessment including psycho-social, and alcohol and substance use histories;
 - 2. Make initial treatment determinations and recommendations based on the client's treatment needs. They must also be prepared to continuously reassess the client to insure he or she continues at the level of correct care;
 - 3. Assure that each client has a valid consent on file to release information to the Court;
 - 4. Provide on-site urine or breathalyzer testing for all clients at any time use is suspected. ***See Section X. Drug Screening*
 - 5. Refer clients to resources that can provide other services for which the client has shown the need during the course of treatment; and
 - 6. Continuously provide the treatment team with reports of the client's attendance progress in treatment, need for changes in the level of care or type of treatment and any change in status.
- i. The Drug Intervention Program shall only utilize treatment agencies which are licensed and/or certified by the State.
- j. Prior to acceptance into the Drug Intervention Program, the treatment provider shall provide the treatment team with a written assessment as to the suitability of the defendant for the program.
- k. Prior to each Court appearance, the treatment provider shall submit a report of progress which documents drug test results, compliance with treatment appointments and any relevant information to the coordinator, who will then prepare a report for the treatment team.
- l. The treatment provider shall maintain for each participant confidential case management documentation including the initial assessments and treatment plans, progress notes, services provided, attendance records and drug test results.
- m. Prior to the completion of each Phase, the treatment provider shall prepare a summary of progress to the treatment team.
