ORDER ON VICTIM IMPACT STATEMENTS  
(DEFENDANT'S MOTION #82)

The above and foregoing motion came on for a hearing on August 21, 2006, with the Defendant present, and after hearing argument of counsel for the State and the Defendant, and a review of the statements submitted, the Court enters the following order:

STATEMENT OF MR. ROY BLALOCK

The statement of Roy Blalock is admissible with the following deletions:

- (1) In Q3 the phrase "wish I could have stopped it"
- (2) In Q5 the phrase "my family has been their (sic) for me"
- (3) The handwritten attachment to the questionnaire in its entirety

STATEMENT OF MR. TONY BLALOCK

The statement of Tony Blalock is admissible with the following deletions:

- (1) The addendum attached to the questionnaire

STATEMENT OF MELISSA PEELER

The statement of Melissa Peeler is admissible with the following deletions:

- (1) On page 2, the phrases: "I can't seem to find the way through the fog of the word murder."

"The way things happened and the way our rights were not upheld by our law enforcement has made me to where I trust no one."

"Although my mom Nola did teach me one thing in life and that was to hold my head high and keep fighting, and that is exactly what I plan to teach my children."

(2) On page 3, "Family should learn to be close because you never know what the outcome is going to be."

(3) On page 3, "Yet we get up every morning and keep moving, just as they would want us to. Now aw far as my children they go into shock every time we are pulled over by a police officer or even go through a road block. The lights from the police cars brings back so many memories of when they crashed and they just cannot understand what took the police, that they are supposed to be able to trust in protecting them, so long to find them. In result of how this crime impacted our lives is as devastating in every way."

(4) The entire first paragraph on page 4 beginning "on January 7, 2004 . . . and ending with "forgotten."

(5) On page 7, "She truly believed in God no matter weather (sic) she got to go to church every Sunday or just every now and then."

(6) On Page 11, "and this is how she ended every day was with a prayer for her babies. In her own way she brought a light to this county/state she was loved by everyone"

(7) The last full paragraph on page 11 beginning "Life without . . ." and ending with ". . . hearts."

The State is directed, through the Victim Assistance Office, to revise the above statements in narrative form, without the attendant questions, and submit the revised statements to defense

counsel and the Court prior to the October 27, 2006, hearing.


